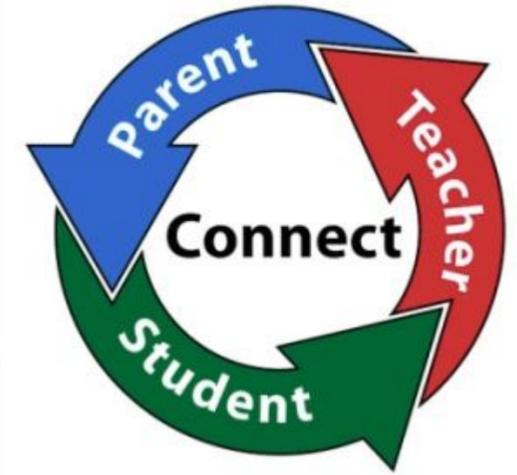

The Digital Landscape



Definition: *Responsible and ethical behaviour online*

Today's children are growing up in a highly connected world

Benefits: *Access to information, global communication, educational resources*

Challenges: *Online safety, privacy concerns, cyberbullying, screen time management*



School's Role in Digital Safety



- Robust internet filters and firewalls
- Teaching digital literacy and online safety is part of the curriculum
- Monitoring student online activity on school devices
- Providing secure, age-appropriate digital platforms for learning
- Regular staff training on digital safety and emerging online trends (e.g. new apps, games, social media platforms)



Cyberbullying Awareness



Definition:

Using digital technologies to deliberately hurt or harass others

Signs:

Sudden mood changes, avoiding devices, secretive behaviour

School actions:

Anti-bullying policies, reporting systems, counselling support

Advice for parents:

Open communication, monitor online activities, save evidence



Privacy and Personal Information

Importance of protecting personal data online

School measures:

Secure student information systems, data protection policies

Teach children about strong passwords

Discuss the permanence of online posts

Review privacy settings on social media accounts together

Screen time Management

Balancing online and offline activities is crucial for child development

School approach:

Structured device use during class, tech-free zones

- Set clear rules and time limits for device use
- Encourage outdoor activities and face-to-face interactions
- Model healthy digital habits



Digital Footprint Awareness

Definition: *The trail of data created through online activities*

School education:

Teaching students about long-term consequences of online actions

- **Discuss the impact of online posts on future opportunities, relationships, and reputation**
- **Regularly review and clean up your child's online presence**
- **Encourage positive content creation**



Digital Footprint Awareness



- **Discuss the impact of online posts on future opportunities, relationships, and reputation**

Colleges, employers, and others often review online profiles. Encourage them to share content that reflects their best qualities.

- **Regularly review and clean up your child's online presence**

Help them to review accounts, privacy settings, and shared content.

Delete old, unnecessary, or inappropriate posts, reinforcing them of the importance of managing their online content

- **Encourage positive content creation**

Motivate them to use the internet to showcase their achievements, hobbies, and passions, creating positive content and building a digital



Parental Controls and Monitoring

School measures:

Content filtering on school networks and devices

- Internet service provider parental controls
- Device-specific restrictions (e.g., Apple's Screen Time, Google Family Link)
- Third-party monitoring software
- Balancing safety with trust and privacy
